Tess and Alex grabbed their lunches, got some money for bus tickets and went to school.


Tess and Alex got a bus to the sports oval with the other kids from their class. Mrs Long went with them, too.

All the kids were very excited.




At the sports oval, the kids stood in a circle around Mrs Long. She split them into two teams — the blue team and the red team.

Everyone ran as fast as they could to the first event.




The first event was the shapes race.

Alex's team was the first to get through all the shapes.






The next event was bowling.

Each team had to knock down all ten pins. One by one, the kids stood behind a line and rolled a ball towards the pins.


But no one could knock down all ten pins.

"Let's go!" shouted Alex. "The blue team is winning!"


The red team finished the long jump event and ran to catch up to the blue team.

everywhere!




"Come on, red team!" shouted Alex.
